



## **Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement**

This statement comprises the slavery and human trafficking statement of FWB Products Limited for the financial year 2022/2023. The company makes this statement pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. Modern slavery encompasses slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labour; we are committed to acting ethically and with integrity and transparency in all business dealings.

The company is a specialist supplier of industrial goods, specialising in tools, fasteners, pipeline, electrical, workwear and PPE.

All of our staff are either employed directly. Our business is managed from our premises at Whieldon Rd, Stoke-on-Trent ST4 4JE.

Within the present financial year, the company has implemented this statement, the Anti-Slavery Statement, aimed at ensuring that no modern slavery or human trafficking takes place in any of the company's business or supply chain.

The policy reflects the company's commitment to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls aimed at combating slavery and human trafficking. Responsibility for the policy rests with the company's Directors.

The company has a zero-tolerance policy towards slavery and human trafficking. In order to ensure that all persons within the company's supply chain comply with the company's values and ethics the policy also includes measures targeted at the company's suppliers.

In order to ensure proper understanding of the risks posed by modern slavery and human trafficking in the context of the firm's supply chains and our business, FWB Products Limited intends to provide training to its employees as appropriate.

This Policy will be reviewed annually or upon reform or amendment of legislation.
